# Murias, Georgetown Prep (Md.) Defeat St. Stephen's/St. Agnes (Va.) in 3 OTs

In his first full year on the varsity, Georgetown Prep senior midfielder **Fern Murias** has developed a penchant for making big plays.

None was bigger than the goal he scored 2 minutes 48 seconds into the third overtime to lead the Little Hoyas past St. Stephen's/St. Agnes, 6-5, in a game pitting two of the top teams in the Washington DC area.

The Saints (9-1) won the face-off to start the third overtime. But Georgetown Prep senior defenseman **Alex Blonsky** intercepted a pass and fed Murias in transition. Murias took it all the way and scored on a running shot past senior goalie **Ben Levy** (14 saves).

It was the second three-overtime game this year for the Little Hoyas (9-2).

They lost to St. Paul's (Md.), 9-8, in three overtimes on March 23. Murias helped send that game into overtime after he held Georgetown-bound senior **Jeff Fountain** without a shot in two isolation plays in the final minute of regulation, one from behind the goal and one from the top of the offensive box.

"That three-overtime loss was a tough one," Georgetown Prep coach **Kevin Giblin** said. "Then we went down to play Collegiate (Va.), took 52 shots and lost 10-6. You'd think if you take 52 shots you are going to score more than six goals, but give Collegiate credit, they played a nice game that day. It's tough when these games go into three overtimes."

The Little Hoyas were tough on defense throughout Tuesday's game.

They gave up a six-on-six goal on the opening possession -- sophomore **Brent Armstrong** sped past Blonsky and scored -- but no other goals were six-on-six. The Saints scored three times in transition and once in extra-man, just a second after a penalty had been released. (The Georgetown Prep player had not rejoined play so it was still an E.M.O. goal.)

Senior defenseman **Robert Posniewski** epitomized the defense's strong day. He scored one goal, the first of his high school career, in transition in the third quarter. Players he guarded scored none.

That included his matchup against Saints junior **David Solomon**. The two matched against each other for much of the fourth quarter and all three overtimes, after Solomon moved to attack from midfield.
